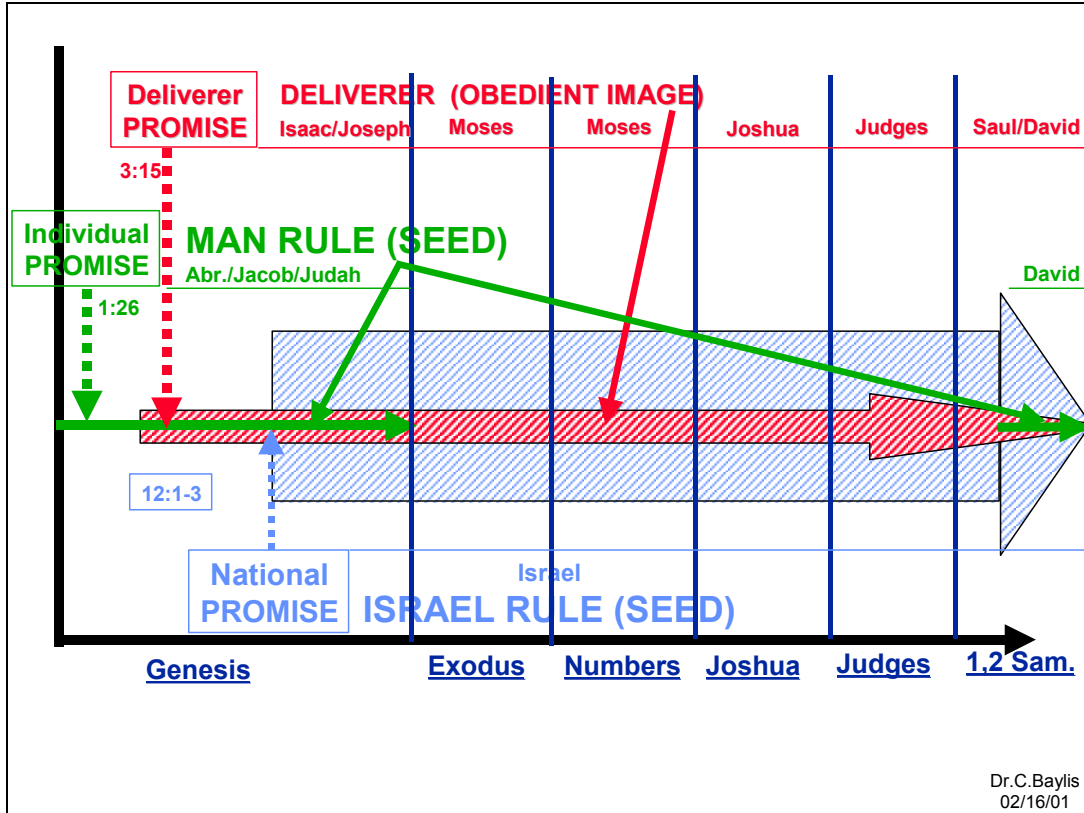


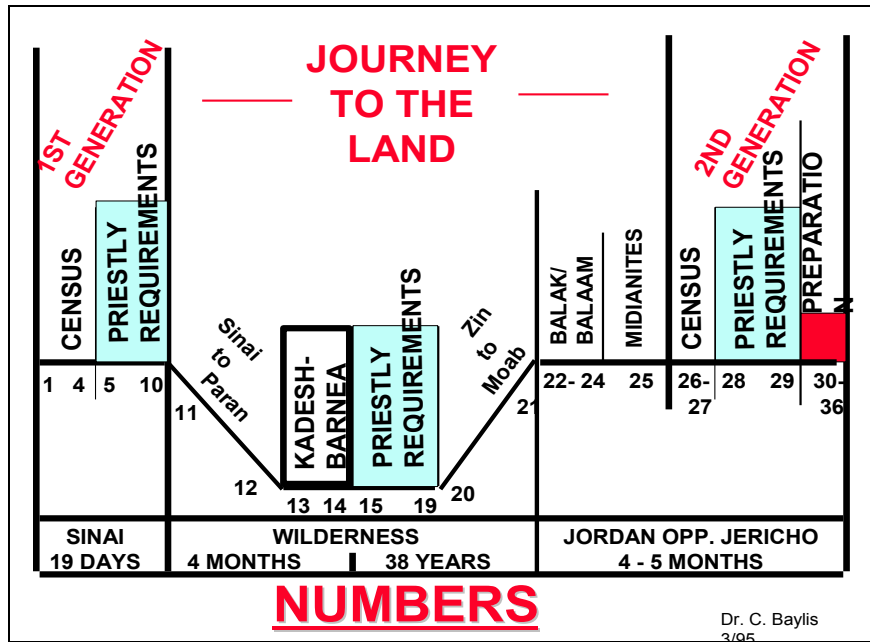

THE EQUIPPING: THE LAND

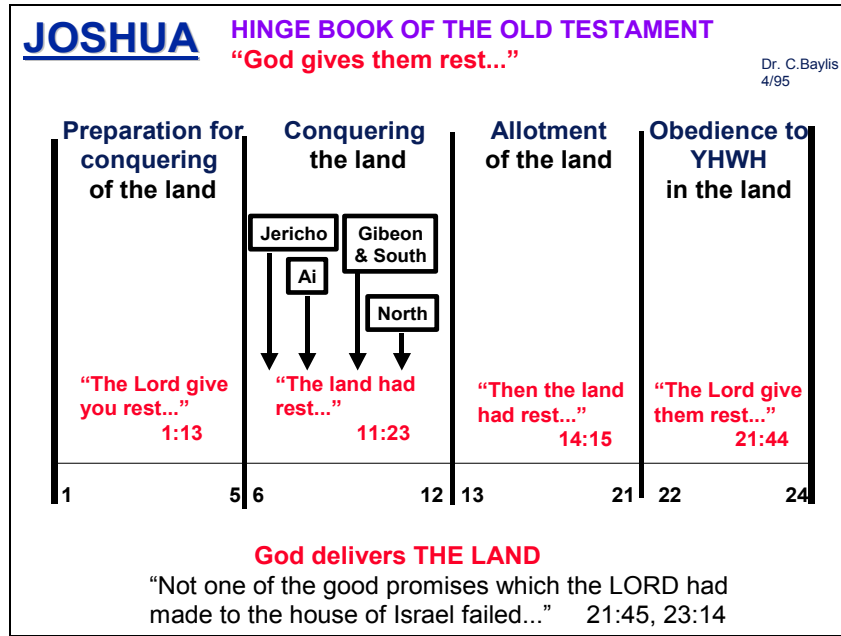
Numbers to Joshua



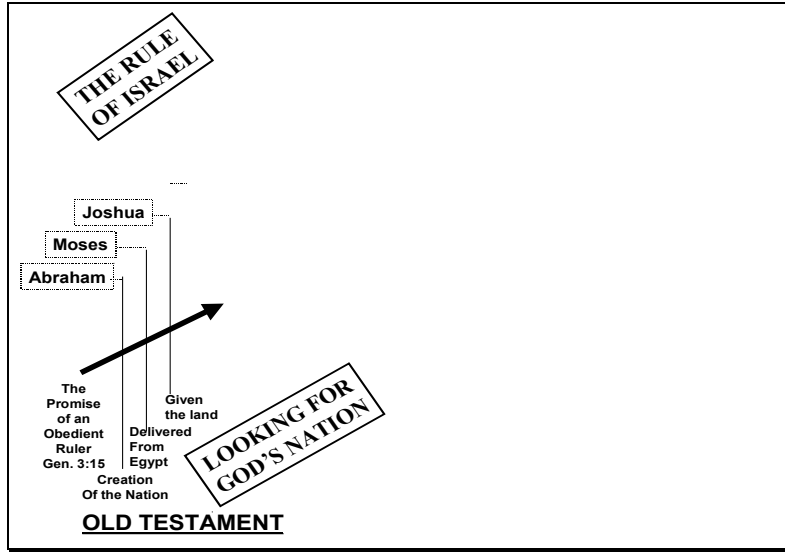
GIVEN A LAND (Numbers - Joshua) but with another generation and another leader.



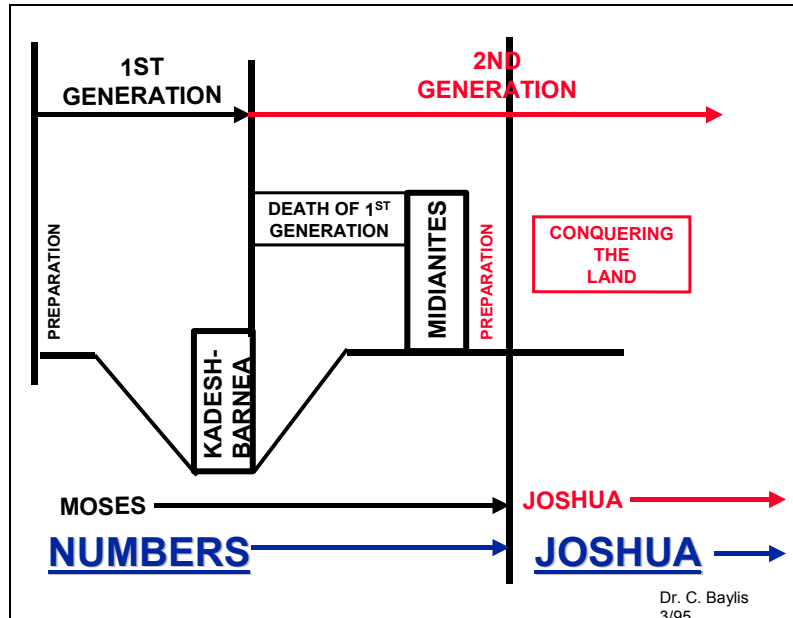
- I. **Numbers:** The Nation is now sovereignly guided and protected as God takes them to an identifiable place on the earth where they will enjoy the blessings as they rule over the earth.
 - A. The instruction of the nation Israel, the first generation out of Egypt, to obey so that they might represent God. **(1—10)**
 - B. The failure along the way to Kadesh-Barnea and the rejection of God and the Leadership in Moses at the entrance to Canaan. **(11—14)**
 - C. God’s faithfulness to His promise to Abraham as He executes the first generation and instructs Moses in Joshua on the provision to enter the land with a new generation. **(15—36)**



- II. **Joshua**: God raises up a Second Generation and a new Leader in Joshua to enter and conquer the land as promised to Abraham in Genesis 14.
- A. The instruction of the new leader, Joshua, the new Moses to lead them into the land. **(1—5)**
 - B. The failure of the new leader to act according to the covenant as God’s agent and to regret the deliverance through the Jordan, yet God’s faithfulness to deliver them the land. **(6—12)**
 - C. The faithfulness of God to conquer the Land through the New Leader and the New Generation, though the boundaries are not those of Gen. 14. **(13—24)**



SUMMARY



THE ULTIMATE FULFILLMENT OF NATION ISRAEL IN ITS REPRESENTATION OF GOD

1. Numbers: A prophet like Moses will lead them to the land

The nation Israel will reject the offer of the Kingdom (in the land) as they did at Kadesh-Barnea in the rejection of their leader. Yet God will raise up another generation to proceed into the land (kingdom) under a new leader, Joshua.

3:1 Therefore . . . consider Jesus . . . 2 He was faithful to Him who appointed Him, as Moses also was . . . 3 For He has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses . . . 5 Now Moses was faithful in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken later; 6 but Christ *was faithful* as a Son . . . Indeed, did not all those who came out of Egypt *led* by Moses? 17 And with whom was He angry for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness? 18 And to whom did He swear that they should not enter His rest, but to those who were disobedient? 19 And *so* we see that they were not able to enter because of unbelief.

2. Joshua

A Prophet Like Joshua who will lead them into the Land and the rest.

4:8 For if Joshua had given them rest, He would not have spoken of another day after that. 9 There remains therefore a Sabbath rest for the people of God.
